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






















Dr Paye is the first ever recipient of HRH Princess Galyani Vadhana Classical Music Funds, and the first Thai violinist to perform at Carnegie Hall with the Grammy-award winning Orpheus Chamber Orchestra. With his musician sisters he formed the Vietrio group and music school. An entrepreneurial musician, Dr Paye is music director of the Thai Youth Orchestra, successfully taking it into international competition, while transforming it into a social enterprise. He is proud that TYO was the first orchestra to emerge out of lockdown to perform 20 concerts last year, much in line with his goal of taking Thai musicians global and raising the bar in music education. Lately he has also had a very visible online presence with Jeeb Ensemble, a group of young professional musicians who make classical music more accessible to the younger generation. He credits Mozart—his birth date twin—for influencing his music, his father for introducing him to the violin and Picasso for making him think outside the box. In his free time, he might be cheering for Arsenal, checking out Blinkist, or seriously working out.















New York-based Thai-Indonesian artist Amanda is known for the public art campaign, "I Still Believe in Our City" which called attention to anti-Asian hate crimes against AAPI (Asian-American and Pacific Islander) New Yorkers. Though carrying society's pain has been a challenge for her, she is proud of having found her own path through which she can foster belonging, joy, and resilience in others. Her passion includes deep conversations with dear friends old and new, and long meditative walks. As a neuroscience graduate from Colombia, she believes that neuroscience tells us that when we are ostracised our bodies react as if we are experiencing physical harm, but through her art, she is fostering a sense of belonging in communities so society can heal and thrive, and the trauma isn't passed down in our DNA to the next generations. Her work appeared on the cover of the March 2021 issue of TIME magazine. Apart from fighting systemic racism, she is also passionate about climate change.

MAKEUP ARTIST AND BEAUTY BLOGGER "PEARYPIE" TURNED CULTURAL ACTIVIST















Once at the apex of the beauty blogger pyramid in Thailand, Amata, or Pear, realised that her ego was getting the better of her. Embarking on a journey of discovery, the Central St Martins graduate insists she is "still in the process of learning, experiencing and reflecting". She began reconnecting with nature by holding a Nature Learning Camp in Chiang Dao, Chiang Mai, using art as a communication tool. She now incorporates traditional folk wisdom into her work, such as natural dyeing techniques with mud. Today, nature, folk communities, food and culture—particularly handwoven textiles—have replaced makeup as her communication tools. With her movements limited during the past pandemic, Pear started her own green space on her rooftop, growing edible plants. This has taught her about biodiversity, native plants, herbal medicine, and encouraged her to move towards a plant-based diet. She also consults with the Ministry of Culture, Tourism Authority of Thailand, The Support Arts and Crafts International Centre of Thailand and universities on the topic of textiles.





A composer, pianist, and artist, Anothai Nitibhon received a PhD in composition from the University of Edinburgh. Anothai's proudest achievement was being honoured with the Silpathorn Award 2021 for music. Orchestras and ensembles in many countries have performed her compositions. Anothai often appears as a judge for composition and performance competitions both in Thailand and overseas. 








Switching from being a medical doctor to a scientist was a good move for Assoc Prof Dr Arunee, who was recently awarded L'Oréal Thailand For Women in Science Special Fellowships for Covid-19. She was recognised for her outstanding work in the research and development of Covid-19 diagnostic tests, therapeutic agents, vaccine for Covid-19 and the monitoring of the SARS-CoV-2 evolution. This working mom has achieved much in the past year including collaborative efforts to identify that compounds in the finger root extract effectively inhibit the SARS-CoV-2 virus; publishing a manuscript to demonstrate Anti-SARS-CoV-2 activity of fah talai jone herb; and the efficacy of Covid-19 vaccines on virus variants. She is inspired by Anthony Fauci, Elon Musk as well as the film Dead Poets Society where students are taught to look at things through a different perspective. She hopes to build a diverse, appropriately skilled and motivated science workforce for emerging viruses research and support others to access her BSL3 facility for COVID19 research.

Best known by his creative alias, Apolar, 29-year-old Arus Angchuan made headlines in 2020 as the illustrator chosen to design the artwork for the 20th anniversary commemorative edition of the *Harry Potter* books in Thailand. After months of submission, publishers both locally and in England selected Arus to design the covers of all seven volumes, as well as the books' chapter headers and souvenir items like postcards, bookmarks and a fold-out paper model of Hogwarts. A Chulalongkorn Architecture alum and former video game designer, Arus or Arch now illustrates fulltime as a freelance artist, specialising in book cover arts and character illustrations.

Comprising seven musicians—Tontrakul Kaewyong, Narisara Sakpunjachot, Phoowich Tawasinchanadech, Thitirat Dilokhattakarn, Kritamet Kittiboonyatiwakron, Preeda Kesdee, Suntorn Duangdang—and one singer, Amornphat Sermsap, Asia7 combines Thai contemporary, fusion, jazz, pop and world music into an earpleasing genre that highlights its Asian roots. Instruments include saw Thai fiddle, Isan folk instruments, saxophone, guitar, keyboard, bass and drums, with electronic embellishments. Meeting up as students of Mahidol University's music department, they all wanted to add novelty to the local music industry and began performing in restaurants and events. They made their debut in 2016 at the Thailand International Jazz Conference. The following year saw them perform at the ACC World Music Festival in Gwangju, South Korea, followed by an extensive world tour that helped them confirm their identity. They have produced several singles that vary between instrumental and vocal music, and have also collaborated with local and international artists. They are now contracted to GMM Grammy and recently represented Thailand via online concerts at the Seoul Friendship Festival 2021.








Aukrit is the CEO behind one of Thailand's most successful and well-known agritech startups, Ricult. Ricult is a multi-award-winning, venture-backed social enterprise founded by MIT alumni that leverages machine learning and satellite imagery to help farmers increase their yield and their profitability. Currently operating in two countries, Thailand and Pakistan, Ricult's mission is to lift farmers out of poverty by equipping them with modern tools and know-how. In the past year, despite having to work a lot from home and being restricted from personally visiting farmers, Ricult has managed to scale up their platform to service 500,000 farmers in Thailand, directly impacting these farmers' communities and livelihoods. Now Aukrit has his sights set on expanding Ricult to 1 million farmers in Thailand and rolling out to nearby countries such as Vietnam and Indonesia.

Shananya Phataraprasit





Chananya is the CEO of Araksa Chiang Mai, a little tea plantation situated on the foothills of the rich forest of Chiang Mai Province that produces high quality organic tea. Araksa is the first tea garden in Thailand both USDA and EU certified organic for both farm and factory. She is proud of her successful efforts to make tea sustainably, using local hybrid Assam tea plants. She not only runs the business, but tastes, grades, and makes sensory descriptions of the teas, which have won several awards. She also owns Asian Oasis, a tour operator that combines travel with sustainability, community engagement and environmental protection. To overcome the marketing challenges of a boutique tea, she takes creative routes such as virtual international tea summits, partnering with European stores selling sustainable products, and through specialty tea podcasts. A contemporary art lover, she believes making tea is like making art, with much beauty in the shapes, colour, feel and aroma. She advocates for the hill tribe community in Thailand through her Himmapaan Foundation which provides education, healthcare, and women empowerment.

Chanut "Work" Pongpanich

Chanut uses his background as a theatre arts graduate from Chulalongkorn University to enhance healthcare providers' service, focusing on empathic communication skills that build rapport between doctor and patient. The pandemic meant he had to initiate online courses for doctors and nurses who were suffering from task overload, and to help reduce the burnout rate. For this, he drew on his experience as an acting teacher for children with special needs, adapting performing art techniques to enhance their social skills. For his master's degree research, he created a sensory theatre for audiences with autism. What he is most proud of, however, is setting up a sensory children's theatre in his house with his mother, a retired psychiatric nurse for children with autism. He has also embarked on a PhD programme on empathic communication which has been under the radar in Thailand so far. He hopes to convey a message about diversity and equality through his work. He is inspired by the magic of story-telling in William Saroyan's "The Human Comedy".














Nestled in the historic area of Charoen Krung sits a petite but eye-catching eatery, Charmgang Curry House. They were all part of the kitchen team at Nahm, mentored by David Thompson, before regrouping to establish Charmgang. The group's shared love of cooking has been ever-present, and each chef possesses a different culinary skill set. With Mew's art of cooking with fire, Jai's passion and taste for curries, and Aew's penchant for the spices, the trio brings together their combined expertise to create a gastronomic and daring experience unique to Charmgang, representing a new generation of Thai food while preserving the art, flavours, and history of its roots.

Shidchanok "Nan" Chidchob



HEMP AND CANNABIS ADVOCATE













This Chelsea College of Arts graduate was director of merchandising for football team Buriram United, but more recently has been growing hemp and conducting R&D with cannabidiol (CBD) as well as hemp fibre. This further expanded her community work with local weavers for her merchandising projects. The pandemic forced her to move back to her hometown of Buriram where she began the hemp project, her first inroad into the field of agriculture. She is hopeful that hemp can become a new economic crop for local farmers. By the end of the year she plans to open a hemp extraction plant that will allow farmers to grow this crop commercially. She considers herself lucky that she can use her passions for gardening and crafting in her work. As a sustainability advocate, she switched many of Buriram United's apparel to recycled polyester, with plans for more sustainable material in the future.

Shris Potranandana



LAWYER, POLITICIAN, CO-FOUNDER ZEN-DAI













Fulbright scholar Chris graduated with a master's degree in antitrust law and economics from UC Berkeley, during which time he was also president of the Student Organisation of Advance Legal Studies. He co-founded DC Capital LLC and also embarked on a political career as co-founder of Future Forward Party. Seeing the lack of access to hospital treatment for Covid-19 victims which often led to unwarranted deaths, he set up Zen-dai volunteer group in April 2020 to provide transportation and access for Covid patients to get tested or treated. Pick-up trucks, vans, mobile phones were rounded up from friends to set up a call centre and delivery system, offering hope to those who could not reach government facilities. They also set up Zen-dai House as a hospitel for patients for whom home quarantine was not an option. Within two months, Zen-dai had completed over 2,000 Covid shuttles, and helped over 1,500 patients.

David Jou can be considered the Father of Online Fashion shopping. Before Pomelo, he was co-founder of Lazada Thailand, which began the country's fascination with online shopping. His background in the NY private equity industry inspired him to launch his own business, and he was ahead of the game in digital marketing. Not so surprising, since he had already launched his own business as a student at Amherst College, Massachusetts, providing logistics, storage and shipping services for fellow university students. With nine student dormitories in his network, he was kept quite busy. His next student business was selling used uni textbooks. His businesses were conducted on Facebook which had only been launched a year earlier. He chose Thailand for his own start-up after considering the e-commerce potential and the growth of smartphones. Under his leadership, Pomelo is not only the region's leading online fashion retailer, delivering to over 50 countries, it also plans to expand its physical outlets, and offer a B2B consultancy service for fashion and lifestyle brands.

Dominic Puwasawat Chakrabongse

As society becomes more eco-conscious and the threat of plastic waste on our environment looms near, there is one person on the frontlines helping tackle this issue at its core. Dominic Puwasawat Chakrabongse, director of Precious Plastic Bangkok, has found an alternative solution to deal with the plastic waste crisis that is affecting marginalised communities all over Bangkok. Upon graduating with a degree in Environmental Policy at the London School of Economics, Dominic returned to Bangkok to open a branch of Precious Plastic, a non-profit organisation founded in the Netherlands, and now works full time with local communities to build simple plastic recycling machines that give trash a second life by melting them into new products. As a full-time environmental activist, Dominic hopes to expand his efforts in furthering awareness about plastic waste outside of Bangkok, while also hoping to partner with educational institutions to establish a programme educating the youth on the global plastic crisis.

FOUNDER AND MANAGING DIRECTOR EMPATHY SAUCE CO LTD















This dance movement psychotherapist established Empathy Sauce to spread and embed empathy into Thai urban society through activities, self development sessions, classes, and organisational development. The pandemic was a tough ride for her, with the resignation of her working partner, the loss of family members, and the collapse of a family dream project. But she pulled through with the help of self-empathy, and a supportive husband. On top of that, she even managed to build her Empathy Sauce Studio. She believes in the innate beauty of humankind, and that respect and care for others can be achieved through empathic communication. She sees performing art as a poem of human skills and mindset, showing how far a human being can go. She also hosts *R U OK* podcast for *The Standard*, and is a core member of B-Floor Theatre, conducting various roles including artist, actor, director, producer, designer, and financial officer.

Founder and director of Wildlife Friends Foundation of Thailand (WFFT), one of the largest animal welfare organisations in South East Asia, Edwin Wiek has made it his life's mission to be a voice for the voiceless. Originally from Holland, the Dutchman relocated to Thailand in 1989 to help build a fashion accessories company where, two years later, he would find himself in a life-changing incident that convinced him to sell his company and pursue a cause passionate to him: animals. With humble beginnings, Edwin began caring for stray animals while residing in temples with two of his friends. Twenty-one years later, the foundation has grown considerably, boasting 124 employees, dozens of volunteers, and offices in Thailand and Laos. WFFT facilitates several different projects including animal rescue, rehabilitation, and veterinary care to both wild and domestic animals. Wiek's goal is to provide these services for as long as possible as he believes giving back to society is what keeps it moving forward.

Surrounded by art at a young age, Eric Bunnag Booth keeps both the legacy of Jim Thompson and his family's personal art collection alive and thriving. Born to Patsri Bunnag and Bill Booth, and raised in France by stepfather Jean Michel Beurdeley, Eric is also cofounder of the MAIIAM and Maielie Contemporary Art Museums. Eric has worked to regenerate the Jim Thompson brand, making it modern and relevant. In keeping with his family's history in art collecting, Eric outfitted the Jim Thompson House with an art gallery and continues to preserve local art and culture at the Jim Thompson Farm. He is also most recently overseeing an expansion of Bangkok's Jim Thompson Art Center. With his stepfather Jean Michel Beurdeley in 2016, Eric opened MAIIAM in Chiang Mai to showcase his family's art collection as well as host exhibits to showcase art from handicrafts to contemporary works. Eric was awarded the Knight grade of the Order of Arts and Letters from the Ministry of Culture of France in 2019.

With a passion for the environment and love for the natural world, Florian is managing director and co-founder at Wildchain, a gamifying conservation funding platform. Florian grew up in rural Bavaria where he helped shepherd the endangered Tauernsheck goat away from extinction. This conservation initiative inspired him to focus towards environmental efforts like species extinction, biodiversity loss and climate change. Wildchain is a non-profit organisation with the mission to inspire and empower individuals and organisations to protect endangered species and their habitats. It uses a climate action tool that allows you to adopt wildlife and to plant trees to cut your carbon footprint and support real-world conservation efforts—all within a mobile game. In addition to his love for animals, Florian appreciates innovation. He initiated FabLab Bangkok at KX Knowledge Xchange, a 1000+ m² innovation space focused on digital fabrication, community engagement, and impact as well as initiatives such as clean-tech hackathons, design thinking workshops, and the creation of an online learning platform for corporations.

Fuadi attended Harvard University, John F Kennedy School of Government and is earning his PhD in politics and international relations at the *University of Oxford*. He developed an interest in coffee in 2012 and started producing coffee in 2014. Now one of the co-founders of Beanspire Coffee, a green bean exporting company, his primary goal is to work with Thai coffee farmers during the harvest season to improve and build a solid product to connect to a global coffee market, and develop Thailand as a specialty coffee origin. He's been recognised for creating a positive social impact, including supporting students in relief efforts after the tsunami in 2004. FOUNDER BANGKOK COMMUNITY HELP













American entrepreneur Greg Lange, owner of the Mexican chain Sunrise Tacos and several Subway outlets in Bangkok, is the founder of Bangkok Community Help. With experience running a charity in the US, he now volunteers providing hot meals, bags of rice and other supplies to families in need during the Covid-19 pandemic. At the start of 2020, he was approached by members of the Klong Toei community asking to use the kitchen of his restaurant to prepare hot meals for people living in the area. This got him interested in helping others as well. He started visiting slums and soon realised that many were facing problems which included dirty garbage sites infested by rats, dilapidated houses, lack of food, basic sanitation facilities among many others. He and his deeply committed volunteers began to work on various re-painting, cleaning, renovation, and construction projects. This group's work inspired more local and expat volunteers to join hands and that's when Bangkok Community Help was formed. He now volunteers with the group "Dinner From the Sky" and shares his experiences on the Bangkok Community Help Facebook page.

COUNTRY DIRECTOR GOOGLE THAILAND













Being appointed as country director of Google Thailand in September 2019, Jackie Wang originally joined Google Thailand's sales team, transferring from McCann Worldgroup in 2014. Bringing experience working for Google in the US as a brand manager, her leadership at Google Thailand has seen audiences soar, especially during the pandemic. YouTube watch time in Thailand rose 20% in the first six months of 2020, compared with the same period a year earlier. Wang's focus when the virus first spread was to make sure people had the information and tools they needed to help cope with the situation. Google Thailand plays a part in supporting the community both in short-term and longterm response to the virus by promoting authoritative and reliable information; supporting education and learning; and contributing to business continuity and economic recovery. Wang believes it is crucial that people have access to health information they can trust online to make the right decisions to protect themselves and those around them from the pandemic.

Yui Jantanarak is a pioneer and visionary in EdTech startups. Since founding StormBreaker Venture as the first Education Technology Incubator in Thailand in 2018, her organisation has invested in and incubated 14 EdTech startups and other education social ventures as well as provided intensive mentorship, bootcamps, business development, and a funding runway for them. When Thailand was badly impacted by the floods of 2011, she created her first public park—Chulalongkorn Centenary Park—which used the laws of gravity to drain water by simply inclining the entire park to collect rain. The same concept applied to Thammasat University Urban Rooftop Farm, which used rice terraces to slow the runoff and grow food crops. In 2020, Chao Phraya Sky Park was created from an abandoned skytrain track to become a bridge park across the river complete with a walkway and a bicycle track. Her projects appear in "Seat At The Table", a docuseries in preparation for COP2020. Among her accolades are TIME 100 Next, 100 BBC Women, Bloomberg 30 for 2020, and UN Global Climate Action Awards 2020, Women for Results.

ridtat "Mac" Satharanond

Kridtat, or Mac, became a household name when his drone helped to pinpoint the valve to cut off the chemical leak that was the cause of the massive fire in Bangkok's eastern suburbs in August 2020. Mac had always been keen in robotics and completed his studies from the Institute of Field Robotics, King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi. He plans to use robotics technology to help invalids and the elderly. 

June is a social entrepreneur whose organisation, Vulcan Coalition provides disabled people with job opportunities through Al technology. Made aware that the disabled are equally capable as the able-bodied, but simply lacked opportunity, she set up The Guidelight so disabled university students could access educational materials. This grew into Vulcan Coalition, a platform that accommodates incapacities ranging from impaired vision and hearing to physical and autistic disabilities, and helps the disabled produce data for the clients. She uses the 2E strategy: Empower and Educate, whereby the disabled are hired and educated in AI, data labelling and other similar tasks. The working platform provides codes relating to various disabilities in order to set the preferred screen, mouse, keyboard and shortcut parameters with enlarged icons for people with low vision and light sensitivity. She hopes to show that disabled people are not burdens but a force for progress who can be integrated into society, and that they can drive the Thai AI industry to a position where it can compete with foreign businesses.

Michael J Baines is The Man That Rescues Dogs (TMTRD). An expat in Thailand for 20 years, Michael is a chef by trade but has ditched the kitchen to dedicate his life to the rescue and care of stray dogs in Thailand for the last decade. Based in Chonburi, The Man that Rescues Dogs Foundation currently cares for 950 dogs, a number of which are special-needs dogs, and has established its own vet clinic. Michael is looking to expand the clinic into a fully-equipped pet hospital in order to help treat, vaccinate, and spay and neuter more dogs. The foundation relies solely on donations from around the world to cover its 40,000 baht a day expenses (1.2 million baht per month) and is regarded as one of the best in its efforts of animal rescues in Thailand. It's amazing what one man with a big heart for animals and a big will to save them can accomplish.

Munin Pongsapan is Dean and Associate Professor of the Faculty of Law at Thammasat University. Munin's passion for education led him to become a lecturer at Thammasat University in 2003. Since then, he has taught, researched, and published extensively. He is Co-Editor in Chief of the Thai Legal Studies, the first English-language law journal focusing on Thai law and a subject editor of the internationally accredited Asian Journal of Comparative Law.

Dr Naruporn was recently recognised by L'Oréal's Thailand For Women in Science Special Fellowships for Covid-19 for her study, Preparation and Properties of Hydroxyapatite/Titanium Composite for Microbial Filtration Applications. In simple terms, her study helped to develop a surgical mask capable of filtering H1N1 Influenza A viruses and PM2.5, with 99% efficacy in filtering viruses according to the ASTM F2100 standard. She is proud that her work, which originated to combat PM2.5, has been timely in providing protection for medical frontline personnel against Covid-19. She is now working towards developing a bone substitute material of international standard that will eliminate the need for expensive imports. She also hopes the surgical mask filter will also be made available for the general public in the near future. In her free time, she can be found in her backyard vegetable garden. She finds gardening requires the same dedication as doing research in terms of patience, endurance, observation and attention to details.

WRITER, SCREENWRITER, FILM DIRECTOR SILPATHORN 2021 LAUREATE



As a result of the lockdown which all but killed the live music scene, his company transformed into an agency to connect artists to other corporations for work opportunities. They also expanded into the world of gaming and e-sports, working with Garena Free Fire and Zipmex crypto exchange company. Making music, skateboarding, and helping street dogs fill his private time.

Her upcoming initiatives include promoting the restoration and conservation of coral reefs and the impact of climate change among local people and youths, and promoting the reduction of single use plastics in communities outside of Bangkok and close to coastal areas. She hopes her research work on Arctic-Antarctica and coral reefs will inspire young Thais on the value of marine ecosystems and the importance of international collaborations between Thailand and other Asian countries. Most of all, she hopes to make a difference to protect the marine ecosystem. She enjoys hiking and scuba diving. Not surprisingly, she cites American oceanographer Dr Sylvia Earle as her role model.

Suthasiny or "Moh" launched her startup with Pattamaphon "Pearl" in 2020 to try and reinvent the food supply-chain in Thailand by connecting consumers to agricultural products directly in a sustainable manner. Dr. Warakorn most recently received the Mahidol Science Innovative Educator Award 2021 for contributing to the benefit of society in education innovation as well as his efforts in inspiring students to learn science.

She is proud that from 2018-2021, her brand has been able to share its profits with others as a true social enterprise, and recycle 2,515kg of waste, with a carbon offset of 11,965.5kg CO2-eq, or the amount of CO2 absorbed by 570 trees in a year. Within the next year, she hopes to reduce waste through her work by 10,000 kg, embark on a master's degree programme on energy management, and further link art and science through her work. She hopes her art will make people think more about UN SDG #12 - Responsible Consumption and Production.

Yashovardhan Lohia is Chief Sustainability Officer for family business Indorama Ventures Public Company Limited (IVL), one of the world's leading chemical companies founded in 1994. Appointed to his current position in 2020, Yash has only passion for sustainability and his main goal is to create an effective roadmap to decarbonising the IVL footprint. With a planned recycling target of 750,000 tonnes by 2025, his work has already seen the company recycle more than 270,000 tonnes of polyethylene terephthalate (PET) plastic bottles annually. Following his efforts, Indorama was recognised in SAM's Sustainability Yearbook 2021 with the Silver Class distinction, and remained at the Gold Level in Ecovadis' Sustainability rating. During the start of the Covid-19 crisis, Yash at the helm of Indorama's sustainability initiative started several projects to produce PPE coveralls with recycled PET bottles to support medical personnel.

Vingcheep Atchanont

Yingcheep Atchanont is the programme manager of iLaw, a Thai human rights and legal watchdog NGO popularly known for its efforts to discuss democracy and freedom of expression via social and online media channels. The organisation regularly engages with civil society groups and the general public in efforts to achieve a fairer and more accountable system of justice in Thailand. iLaw, short for Internet Law Reform Dialogue was established in 2009 and is also known for its development of the Freedom of Expression Documentation Centre in 2011, which collects and keeps coverage of arrests and prosecutions and abuses made by law or the authority on issues of freedom of expression. The organisation also organises training programmes for youths on the ideals they strive to bring attention to. iLaw also presented the civil sector's first ever constitutional-amendment motion to go before Parliament though it was overwhelmingly rejected by lawmakers.
